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RIESLING

We are very proud to be showcasing the great diversity of Riesling, it is without a doubt one of the best grape variety in the world, unfortunately often misunderstood. Most of those Riesling are dry and food friendly.

RIESLING ('Reece-ling') must be the world's most misunderstood, and mispronounced, grape variety.

Wine made from Riesling is quite unlike any other. It is light in alcohol, refreshingly high in fruity natural acidity (quite different from the harshness of added acid), has the ability to transmit the character of a place through its extract and unique aroma and, unlike Chardonnay, is capable of ageing for decades in bottle. Like top quality Chenin Blanc, but unlike Chardonnay, it performs best if fermented cool and bottled early without any malolactic fermentation or wood influence. Riesling is a star and, as you may discern, one of my great wine heroes.

Riesling ripens quite early, so when planted in a hot climate its juice can be overripe and flabby long before any interesting flavours have developed in the grapes. In a cool climate such as that of the Mosel valley in northern Germany on the other hand, it is regarded as late ripening relative to the host of precocious varieties that were specially bred for these short summers.

Riesling is an extremely fine candidate for botrytized sweet wines, although this noble rot tends to blur geographical differences and result in thick, almost raisiny deep golden wines usually labelled either Beerenauslese (BA) or Trockenbeerenausles (TBA)

PINOT NOIR

“Pinot Noir is the most fascinating of all red grapes: at its best it is incomparable, it is never boring and it even makes failure acceptable, where Cabernet, Merlot, Sangiovese and Syrah do not, for it always has something to say.”

PINOT NOIR, the fashionable red Burgundy grape is capable of producing divinely scented, gorgeously fruity expressions of place but often unwilling or unable to do so. In Burgundy Pinot Noir is merely the medium through which tiny environmental differences (terroir) express themselves. Flavours found in young red Burgundies include raspberries, strawberries, cherries and violets; with time these evolve into a bouquet often reminiscent of game, liquorice and autumnal undergrowth. (There is an argument that red Burgundy has to be very good indeed to be worth ageing more than about five years...)

For years the received wisdom was that it was almost impossible to make decent Pinot Noir outside Burgundy but by the early 1990s this had definitively been disproved - and if the new wave of New World Pinot Noir for the moment lacks any great expression of place, it in general provides considerably more pleasure per penny than the average bottle of Burgundy. .

The French grow increasing quantities of Pinot Noir outside Burgundy, however, notably in Champagne where it has proved itself the ideal dark-skinned grape for a top quality sparkling wine (for which purpose it is widely used in Italy, California, Australia - and England).

DESSERT WINES

Different techniques:

Noble Rot / Pourriture Noble / Botrytis Cinerea: a very special fungus called *Botrytis Cinerea* attacks the grape and pierces the skin, allowing water to evaporate and thus concentrating the sugar. This is used in the famous region of Sauternes and Tokaji.

Late Harvest: grapes are left on the vine for extra ripeness, then harvested at a later stage than usual, which leaves the wines with residual sugar after fermentation has finished. Examples: Vouvray, Auslese.

Passerillage: originally made on a bed of straw, where the grapes were picked, then left to dry. As the water evaporates, the sugar in the grapes concentrates.

Examples: Jurancon.

Also it could be “passerille” on the vine, with the action of the wind to dry the grape, i.e sometimes happens in combination with noble rot.

Mutage / Fortified: grape spirit is added to a fermenting grape must. This stops the fermentation by killing the yeast, leaving the wine with residual sugar. Examples: Port, Madeira, Banyuls.

Eiswein: Harvesting when the water in the grapes has frozen during a cold, winter night or helping this natural process by modern technology, i.e. freezing the grapes – otherwise known as Eiswein

MADEIRAS

The first grapes were imported from Greece in the 15th century. It was in the 18th century that it became what it is today: a fortified wine suitable for drinking anytime. At first Madeira was a local version of Port, made with different grapes. It was soon discovered that the wine gained a special flavour after having been on a trade ship for some months, often en route to the Portuguese colonies in the East Indies. The reason turned out to be that the heating of the barrels of wine as the ships crossed the tropics gave the wines their distinctive Madeira “tang”: a freshness which, in the sweeter styles balances so well with the sugar.

The Madeira wine trade was developed by the British and the major wine houses were founded by Englishmen. Like Port, it was fortified from the early 18th Century, and was popular in England, though it has always been available in much smaller quantities than Port. Throughout the 18th and 19th Century, increasing quantities were shipped to the United States

Today, the heating, of the simplest wines is usually done artificially though most of the wines we list here are aged naturally in barrel – usually in warm lofts rather than cool cellars. The true Vintage Madeira’s are still stored in oak casks for at least 20 years before bottling. Madeira wine is extremely durable, and for the best wines the older they get, the better they become. It is possible to purchase a Madeira that is up to 200 years old.

There are four distinct types of Madeira:

Sercial which is the driest

Verdelho is medium-dry

Bual is dark and medium-sweet

Malmsey is heavier and much sweeter
